Our services:

The Volunteer Center can offer you any or all of the following services to help ramp up your company's community involvement:

- Survey of employee interests, so your volunteer opportunity can match aspirations of your employees and further your company's community goals.
- Your company/employee interests can be matched with a verifiable community need.
- Organization services include setting dates, organizing equipment/material, create publicity and fliers, taking pictures at the event for company use, etc.

Feedback and data from the event can be provided to your company including monetary value of volunteer services to the community. This information is recorded and accessible through our community volunteer database.

Your Company Investment:

You can have access to turnkey volunteer coordination for your company for an annual investment of **ONLY \$400**.

This fee also includes membership on the **Corporate Volunteer Council**, an advisory council to United Way's Volunteer Center which is responsible for organizing community-wide volunteer recognition events. The CVC meets monthly at United Way of Greater Chattanooga.
